Dotmaker Tours presents **A Power Walk**, the latest addition to its growing collection of creative and intelligent guided walks round London.

The Power Walk surveys London's shifting landscape of power. From monarchs to management, we'll investigate the capital's users and abusers of authority. We'll consider their methods of intimidating, manipulating and controlling us. And we'll hear about the successes and failures of those who have sought to bring the mighty to account.

The one and half mile route from Somerset House to St Paul's Cathedral takes in the awe-inducing architecture of buildings like the Royal Courts of Justice, which-tour goers will visit

to eye up the trappings of judicial power. Tour-goers' attention will also be drawn to bomb scarred churches, bullish monuments and street furniture from early clocks to CCTV cameras that cajole and monitor us.

The London Ear is devised and led by alternative tour guide and lawyer, Rosie Oliver. Says Oliver, "I want to show how this part of London is like a collision zone between the big institutions of power – the church, finance, royalty, government, the courts and the press." But the walk also invites tour-goers to consider their place in this mighty landscape. "It's a chance for us to think about our own powers in the city: how much freedom we have, and our capacity to change things."
