Dotmaker Tours presents a new guided walk: the Rubbish Trip. Join us on this London trail of muck and trash, past and present, its sounds and its smells.

The Rubbish Trip is a new Dotmaker Tours walk by creative tour guide Rosie Oliver. "In London, we pay a lot of attention to stuff – whether out shopping or sight-seeing," says Oliver. "But by doing the opposite and wondering at the waste, we find a city rich in rubbish, even transformed by it."

Oliver will lead us on a 2 mile rummage over the Isle of Dogs and under the river to Greenwich. We'll pass historic dumps and landfills, encounter castaway communities and marvel at the methods of dealing with the capital's waste.

The Rubbish Trip is the latest addition to Dotmaker Tours' growing collection of quirky, intelligent and surreal trips round London. Other tours include a Chimneys & Tunnels walk along the Thames, a Greenwich Safari in search of marvellous beasts made of brick and stone, and a Family Safari for children. Oliver will be leading a Thames Bestiary walk for Viewfinder Gallery later in the Spring.
